

AWS Wine Competition Results

The results are in! The Lehigh Valley Chapter is proud to announce that at the AWS National Conference this year we had members win in both the Amateur Competition and in the Commercial Competition. Drum roll, please!

In the Amateur Competition, <u>Jeff and Donna Lombardo Fisher</u> won 12 medals. This includes a Double Gold for their 2022 Bella Donna, in addition to a Gold, nine Silvers and a Bronze medal.

Dean Scott won a Double Gold for his 2021 Port Hole in addition to two Bronze medals.

In the Commercial Competition, **Folino Estate Winery** won three Double Gold medals for their 2022 Pinot Grigio, 2022 Teodoro Forte, and 2022 Traminette in addition to a Gold, six Silvers, and two Bronze medals. Their Traminette also won Best of Category and their Pinot Grigio won Best of Category and Best of Class for White Vinifera. Congratulations to winemaker **Darrin Scott**.

Virginia is the birthplace of the American wine industry tracing its roots to the days of Thomas Jefferson. Today there are over 300 wineries in the state with many producing exceptional wines year after year. Each spring, the Virginia Governor's Cup, one of the most stringent competitions in the US, is held where wineries throughout the state submit their best offerings to a panel of world class judges. In 2023, 614 wines were sampled with 142 receiving gold medals and the top twelve being designated as the Governors' Cup Case.

For this tasting we have chosen a selection of gold medal winning wines, focusing on the Governor's Cup Case, consisting of four white and five red wines from wineries in Virgina's Blue Ridge Mountains and historic Charlottsville area.

Chairman's Selection - Kathy & Mark Breloff

With the colder weather settling in, we chose 3 reds and 1 white this month chairman tasting. The one thing we learned while over at Hamilton's Crossing Wine and Spirit store, is that right now there is a limited inventory of wines for the Chairman Selection.

VINUM CELLARS CHARDONNAY 2021

VARIETY/STYLE: Chardonnay **REGION:** Monterey, California

RATING: 91pts WE PRODUCT CODE: 000079699

ALCOHOL: 14.5 ABV

\$12.99 (quoted at \$20.00)

Winemaker's notes:

On the palate this wine exhibits subtle creamy custard aromas and backed with lemon verbena and clove. The palate is juicy with ripe mango and wrapped in creamy Tahitian vanilla. The acidity shines through the creamy texture demonstrating the optimal acidity that the cool climate Monterey grapes process. The finish is supple, with guava, passionfruit, and silky, creamy vanilla which finishes with baked apple and creme brûlée custard flavors.

The finish is long with silky elegance and lingering acidity.



We chilled this wine to 45 degrees. We agree with the winemaker's notes on aromas and acidity. When we tasted the wine chilled, we found the acidity not to our liking, however after the wine had warmed up, we found the acidity had softened and we enjoyed it.

HIEROGRAM ZINFANDEL VINEYARD BLOCK NO 8 2021

VARIETY/STYLE: Zinfandel REGION: Lodi, California

RATING: 90pts Wine & Spirit **PRODUCT CODE:** 000079694

ALCOHOL: 15% ABV **\$9.99** (quoted \$18.00)

Winemaker's notes:

Ripe mixed berries with licorice and chocolate notes. The palate is rich and smooth with silky tannins and just the right lift of acidity for balance, lingering easily.

Breloff notes:

This is a dry Zinfandel. We noticed aromas of cherry and chocolate with medium acidity and soft tannins. It's very drinkable. Try this wine with dark chocolate or take our word for it; it was fantastic!

CASA PRIMICIA CRIANZA 2018

VARIETY/STYLE: Tempranillo

COUNTRY: Spain REGION: Rioja

RATING: 92pts WE **PRODUCT CODE:** 000079704

ALCOHOL: 14% ABV

\$9.99 (quoted at \$25.00)

Winemaker's notes:

Aromas of blackberry, purple plums, and charcuterie set the stage for flavors of black cherry, blackberry, bittersweet chocolate, smoke and violet. Hefty tannins fill the palate then back off into plum and black pepper finish.

Breloff notes:

We both really enjoyed this wine. We noted aromas of cherry and chocolate. Mark said he tasted chocolate covered cherries. The tannins softened on the finish.



QUINTA DO CRASTO SUPERIOR TINTO 2016

VARIETY/STYLE: Touriga Nacional, Touriga Franca, Tinta Roriz, Sousao

COUNTRY: Portugal REGION: Douro

RATING: 92pts WE **PRODUCT CODE:** 000085871

ALCOHOL: 13.5% ABV **\$14.99** (quoted \$29.00)

Winemaker's notes:

Crasto Superior is fresh and balanced on the nose. Fresh on the palate, great body, and ripe firm tannins. Very complex notes of dark berried fruit, gum cistus, and cocoa, lingering towards the elegant finish. It has an excellent length and is aged in French oak for about 12 months.

Breloff notes:

We feel this wine needs to be served with food to be enjoyed. So, we paired it with rosemary lamb and it didn't disappoint. In the glass the wine was dark ruby, with notes of cherry. On the palate the cherry continues along with mild tannins.
